

About the Workshop - Troubled Times

This workshop will focus on attachment issues and the impact on children who have experienced abuse and neglect in childhood, we will consider the affect on the brain development, issues of mental illness and trauma in children.

The workshop will offer an opportunity for participants to develop skills in working constructively with children and young people who have challenging behaviour and mental health issues. We also will consider how early attachment issues impacts on future relationships and life choices.

The workshop will be taught through a series of short presentations, scenarios and case studies along with group exercise and discussion to ensure your learning is interesting and informative.

Course Tutor: Aqualma Murray

Aqualma has been in social work for over twenty five years, and has worked with a range of services in most care settings. Her experience as a professional social worker /manager is wide and varied, including child protection, brain injury and working with physical disabilities. Aqualma has worked as the national lead manager for a charity promoting the rights and wellbeing of children who are looked after by local government and within young offender's institutions, secure children's homes and secure training centres.

Aqualma's training style is dynamic, inclusive and valuing of what participants bring and share. She has a MA in advanced social work, post qualifying award in social work, Diploma in counselling survivors of abuse and a certificate in social group work.
